Every Easter over 1,000 disabled and disadvantaged children and young people and their volunteer helpers (doctors, nurses, helpers and priests) enjoy a fun and happy week in Lourdes with the charity HCPT (The Children Pilgrimage Trust). The charity exists to help pilgrims answer the call of Mary to come to Lourdes in procession, a request made to us through Bernadette. This year, the pilgrimage starts on Saturday 20th - Saturday 27th April.

Our parish will be sponsoring two young people as volunteer helpers. They are Margaret Mary Dorrian and Rachel Boyce. They're both pupils from La Sainte Union College(LSU). They are part of Group 147.

Before the Pilgrimage: Preparation for families before their children travel with the group is vital. Children and their parents will have opportunities to meet the volunteer helpers before the trip.

During the Pilgrimage: - The emphasis is very much on ensuring that all children have a wonderful fun-filled week. Each child pilgrim travels with a family group. The groups will be visiting a number of Lourdes attractions, including the Grotto, the house where St Bernadette grew up, the "the Cachot" where she and her family were living at the time of the Apparitions, and some of the many museums in the town. Here are some of their main activities:

- Easter Sunday Mass: the week in Lourdes kicks off on Easter Sunday for many with a Mass and lots of singing.
- Tuesday evening Torchlight Procession: this is a visual and emotional event. All pilgrims in Lourdes are invited to come together for a torchlight procession.
- Thursday Trust Mass: Over 5,000 members of HCPT come together in the underground Basilica. For many this is the highlight of the week.
- Most groups will have a day out, travelling by coach. Evenings feature a varied mix of fun, games, singing, parties and praying.

Her death caused great sorrow not only to her family but to the whole parish community. She was the parish sacristan for many years dating back to Canon Browne's era in the 1970's.

She's the parish priest's right hand person in preparing the liturgy, especially, during the Seasons of Lent, Easter, Remembrance Sunday, Weddings, Funerals, Advent and Christmas. She and Ben, know the Liturgical Seasons and how to appropriately prepare the church.

She was greatly respected, loved (and feared) by altar servers especially, most of them are now grown-ups. She was a welcoming presence when people come to the church and especially in the sacristy. Margaret was a woman of deep faith and commendable integrity. She will be sadly missed.

During the 150th Anniversary of the parish in 2004, Margaret and Ben were awarded the Diocese of Westminster Medal in recognition for their work and commitment to the Faith.

The 'Prayer for Generosity', which many of us learned as children, is associated with St Ignatius Loyola, founder of the Jesuit Order, yet it is unclear whether he actually composed it. To this day it is often known as 'The Scout Prayer' and is used by many Scout groups as a blueprint for the work they do.
