THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD 9th January 2022

BAPTISMAL DEATH AND RESURRECTION

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, we also honour our own baptism as our initiation into the Christian life and community. In the Gospel, the baptism of Jesus, with his immersion and then emergence from the water, points to his later submission to God at his death, and his emergence from the grave at his resurrection. This pattern of death and resurrection is our path too, as followers of Jesus. Throughout life often in small ways, we learn to surrender our limited agendas. This surrender often feels like death. The sacrament of Baptism ritually enacts this pattern to remind us of Jesus' death and resurrection, so that we too might embrace the death and resurrection of our lives. As Jesus emerged from the water, he encountered his Father and the Holy Spirit. Like Jesus, we can know we are God's beloved empowered by the Spirit. @J.S.Paluch.co
