HOLY WEEK: THE MESSAGE OF CHRIST'S LOVE

THE EASTER TRIDUUM – (the name means "three days") marking the days of Jesus' passion, death and resurrection, is the most important time of the church year. It begins with the evening Mass on Holy Thursday, continues on Good Friday and reaches its high point in the Easter vigil on Saturday at 7:00pm and closes on Easter Sunday.

<u>Holy Thursday 14th April at 7:00 pm</u> — Mass of the Lord's Supper. The celebration and Institution of the Holy Eucharist recalls that Jesus sacramentally anticipated the gift He would make of Himself on the Cross. The Mass concludes with the procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the Repository, followed by a silent adoration until 11:00 pm.

Good Friday 15th April at 3;00 pm — today we read the Gospel that describes how Jesus carried the cross, suffering and dying for our sins. This is called the Passion. During this service, we offer prayers for people in our community and our world. We also show our respect and love for the cross and Jesus 'sacrifice. Good Friday services are very serious and quiet: we think about the big sacrifice that God made by sending His Son to die for us.

Holv Saturday 16th April at 7:00pm – This is the time of waiting. Jesus is in the tomb, the apostles are afraid and in hiding. We wait with prayer and hope knowing that Jesus will leave the tomb on Easter and that He will come again someday The Easter Vigil service that begins after dark and includes reading and songs which is the history of our salvation. We light the new paschal candle, symbolizing Jesus, the Light of the World. The people who are joining the Catholic Church are baptized and confirmed at this service and for the first time since Lent began on Ash Wednesday, we can say "Alleluia" again. The service's climax is the celebration of the first Mass of Easter.

Easter Sunday 17th April – Some people think that Christmas is the most important day of the year, but that's only the beginning of everything- Jesus' birth. The biggest day of the year for Christians is Easter! Easter Sunday is a day of joy. At Mass we read how Jesus rose from the dead. Bells ring out, Easter lilies bloom, families share meals and we sing "Alleluia," which means "Praise God!" in any language. We rejoice because Jesus' death has made it possible for us to enter heaven. (@Mgr. Keane)
